

The CHICAGO LIGHTHOUSE

Since 1906 the Chicago Lighthouse for People Who Are Blind or Visually Impaired has been creating opportunities for independent living for people who are blind, visually impaired or blind with additional disabilities. The William Karp Vocational Evaluation Center assists Chicago-area blind and visually impaired persons assess their own abilities, interests and potential. Industrial and office skills are both taught. Newly blinded adults go to the Chicago Lighthouse to learn to cope, adjust and obtain career guidance job skills. The Chicago Lighthouse and iob placement services continue set national to records securing jobs for people who have completed Lighthouse programs. The Eleanor Palmer Development Center for Blind, Multi-disabled Children trains and nurtures young children with handicaps so severe that they cannot attend regular schools.

Recently completed renovation and expansion of the facility enables the Chicago Lighthouse to inrease the number of people served annually to over 11,000 in 1996. New facilities incorporate the most advanced equipment designed to enhance their state-of-the-art teaching techniques.

Donations received at public showings of this salon will supply some of the funds required to provide for non-grant items essential to the operation of the Chicago Lighthouse. A voluntary donation added to your exhibition entry fee also helps to continue their good work.

#### IF YOU'D LIKE TO HELP ...

If you see a blind person walking with a cane or a guide dog and he or she seems confused or is approaching an obstacle, please offer assistance. If you do not know how to assist, <u>ASK</u>!

Do not shout. Persons who are blind usually do not have hearing impairments.

Offer assistance verbally and lightly touch an arm to indicate that you are addressing him or her. DO NOT GRAB the person unless there is an immediate danger.

To lead a person who is blind, offer your arm. The person can take your arm and follow a half step behind you. If the person has a dog, approach the person on his or her free side.

Slow down when approaching curbs, stairs, or revolving doors. Tell the person what you are approaching and place his or her hand on the railing or edge of the door for orientation.

When crossing a street or entering a building, tell the person the street name, the direction in which you are walking and the address of the building.

When offering seating, orient the person to the chair's position by placing his or her hand on the back or arm of the chair.

Announce your departure; never leave your new acquaintance in the middle of a street or other open area.

### THE LIGHTHOUSE SYSTEM OF SCORING

This exhibition was judged with the aid of a two-light "in-and-out" system. This is a method for rapidly weeding out slides of little merit on the first time through the projector. To vote a slide "in," a judge switches on a GREEN light; to vote it "out," he switches on a RED light. Each judge is urged to vote GREEN on any slide he wants to see again and is encouraged to vote generously on the first round. The total number of GREEN lights is recorded and this is the score that appears on your report card.

A majority vote prevails: Two or three GREEN lights have the same value and will keep a slide in the running. Conversely, two or three RED lights must be lit to eliminate a slide from further consideration.

The fact that a slide receives three GREEN lights on the first round does not necessarily ensure honors. It merely means that all three judges want to see it again.

The first round does much to help the judges assess the quality of the submitted slides. On subsequent rounds, each judge must vote on whether or not the image on the screen has salon quality and if it has, the slide is "accepted." The accepted slides comprise the "show" and from them, the "Best Of..." slides are selected for each category.

Judging is continued until just 26 slides remain. From this selection, the 5 "Best Of..." slides (including "Best of Show"), the 5 Lighthouse Medal winners, 15 Honorable Mention winners and the D-M SMITH TROPHY.


